We are certainly experiencing a different end to the 2019/2020 school year and I know I speak for our staff when I say, "We have sure missed our students." We have missed the daily conversations and connection with them and are hopeful that we will get that part back to start the 2020/2021 school year. The past 3 months have been challenging for many, as we have not been able to do the things we are accustomed to doing. While learning online has been good in many ways, it has also been difficult.

We are experiencing changes at VES as we look to the next school year. We are moving more students out of grade 6 than we are expecting to have in ECS, meaning a drop in our school enrollment and a drop in our revenue. This is happening at the same time we are undergoing changes in how schools are funded by Alberta Education. As a result of these changes, we are required to reduce the number of staff in order to maintain a balanced budget. As such, Mrs. Claudette Bast will be moving to another school in BTPS to start the 2020/2021 school year. She has been at VES for several years and has been a valuable part of our team. We wish her well in her new teaching environment. She will be missed at VES. We will also say farewell to Miss Devery Stachura. She joined our staff in November of 2019, taking over for Miss Birch in grade 4. At that time, we were aware that we would likely be overstaffed at the end of the school year. Miss Stachura has fit in well with our staff and will be missed by our students. She too has been a valuable member of our team. We will also begin the new school year without Mrs. Ruth Prill, one of our Instructional Assistants. This too is a budget-related decision. BTPS has also had to make changes to staffing as a result of budget cutbacks. As such, we will be sad to see the departure of our Mental Health Professional (MHP), Mrs. Colleen Pilkey. She has been a valuable asset to several of our students and she will be missed. In addition, we will say farewell to Mrs. Joanne Flath, our Social Emotional Coach (SEC). She will still be working in the same capacity in BTPS, but has been assigned to other schools. We are sad to see her go. However, we will happily welcome our new SEC, Mrs. Tanya Laye. She will be at VES on Wednesday's and Friday mornings, similar to what has been in the past. We will also be happy to welcome back from leave, Mrs. Hallie Zaharko.

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## Vermilion Elementary School Mission Statement:

Within a safe and nurturing community, we at Vermilion Elementary School, will foster personal and academic excellence, while treating each other with dignity and respect. As a team we will be the best we can be.

One of the significant changes in the new provincial budget system is that our revenue is no longer related to our Sept. 30 student count. Our revenue is now based on our previous year enrollment (20%), our current year enrollment (30%) and our projected enrollment for the following year (50%). However, if we do not meet our projected enrollment numbers, we will see adjustments to our budget in the following school year. As a result of the reduction of 1.0 fte teachers at our school, we will be moving to a split class. We will have a grade 2 class, a gr.  $\frac{2}{3}$  split class and a gr. 3 class. This will be a change for VES, as it has been some time since this has been a part of our class structure. A split class is really no different than a single grade class, as learning is often an individual process. Research has shown that students in a split class achieve as well or better than a single grade class. In our decisions regarding teaching assignments for next year, we felt it was important to choose a teacher who has previous experience teaching both the gr. 2 and 3 curriculums. As such, we will be moving Mrs. Thronson to teach this class. We have also made the decision to maintain a slightly smaller class size than the single grade classrooms. We have also been able to timetable a few class periods for the split class where each grade will be alone with their teacher. We have carefully selected students for the split class who we feel can be successful in such a setting, much as we carefully select students for single grade classes. We are confident that students in the split class will be successful.
