

Parents/Guardians/Caregivers/Visitors Entering the School

All visitors to the school must use proper hand hygiene upon entering, and complete the BTPS daily screening app. Visitors, students or staff who feel ill or have symptoms of COVID-19 cannot enter the school.

As you enter the building through the main entrance ONLY, you will follow the visitor protocol outlined here.

- Complete the BTPS COVID-19 app on the ipad provided or use your own device to complete the app. To open the app, scan the QR code with your device camera.
- Sanitize your hands with the provided sanitizer.



• Sanitize the IPAD after use with the provided wipes.

All visitors, including those coming for Vermilion Play Development and Before/After School Care, MUST use the front entrance to enter the building and must follow the visitor instructions in the front entrance.



Parents and visitors are able to park on 49 Avenue, as well as south of the crosswalk on 44 Street. **Please ensure that you are not parking in front of the school in the bus loading/unloading zone from 8:00-9:30 am and from 2:30-4:00 pm.** We ask that parents & visitors also refrain from parking in the staff parking lot as this is reserved for staff members and for safety reasons students may not be dropped off or picked up in the parking lot.



Parents and caregivers must assess their children daily for symptoms of cold, influenza, COVID-19, or other infectious respiratory disease before sending them to school. Anyone showing symptoms listed on the <u>Alberta Health Daily Checklist</u> must remain home. Information about isolation requirements is available here.

If your child is going to be absent/late, even if buses are not running please let your child's teacher know or call the office to notify us. If you have not contacted the school office or teacher to inform us if your child will be absent/late, we will call you to ensure your child is safe. Please note if you are emailing a teacher during the school day, they may not always get them in time to avoid a call from the automated system.



BUS FEE PAYMENTS:

Parents and guardians can now pay their bus fees online. Go to your school website, Parents tab, Pay Fees. You will need your child's Alberta Student Number to make the payment. It can be found on the invoice. For assistance please email <u>transportation@btps.ca</u>. We also accept e-transfers. The email is <u>vivian.locher@btps.ca</u>, and in the message include: school name, child's name, bus route number and bussing service you are paying for (i.e. Vermilion Intown, Wainwright Intown, Yard Service, etc.).

BUS CANCELLATION - COLD WEATHER:

The BTPS Inclement Weather 701.11AP and 701.12AP includes a -40°C clause. If the temperature with or without a windchill factor reaches -40°C buses will not run. The temperature will be read at 6:00 pm the night before and based on the next day projected temperatures (with windchill) between 6:00-9:00 am for the morning run and from 3:00-5:00 pm for the afternoon run. On mornings when weather conditions are poor, parents will be advised by their bus driver and/or by an emergency announcement regarding bus cancellations on the BTPS Website.

PROPER WINTER ATTIRE:

Regardless of the temperature, students should always wear or carry with them appropriate winter attire when riding the school bus.

BUS DRIVER NOTIFICATION:

When the weather is cold it is very important that you let your bus driver know that you will or will not be on the bus so they can adjust their stop times so students are not waiting longer than necessary at their bus stop.

BUS STATUS APP:

Buffalo Trail Public Schools launched their new website in October that comes with the Bus Status App that allows parents to subscribe to their child(ren)'s school bus route. The division will use the Bus Status App to alert parents when a bus is delayed or cancelled. Bus drivers will continue to notify families of bus cancellations, but this will aid in the communication process to ensure no one gets missed. You can download the new Bus Status App by Box Clever on your smart phone or device.



Tap on "All Buses" to find and star the buses you want to received status notifications for. Then select the district in the lower right corner and select "Buffalo Trail Public Schools". If To choose your bus route to get notifications and status alerts, select the bottom middle icon "All Buses" on the main page. Then you can search for your bus route number or driver's name to find your child's bus route. Click on your child's bus route and the star should turn white. If You have now selected your bus route. When there is a change in that bus route's status you will be notified by an alert on the BUS STATUS APP. During spring break, kids can't wait to sleep in (fingers crossed), and parents are thrilled at the idea of not having to make lunches the night before school. With a whole week of child-time ahead, having plans in place will make for a stress-free, fun, and memorable break.

In these pandemic times, think of March break as your very own homemade camp without the super-enthusiastic teen counsellors.

Need ideas for home-based activities that don't include a screen? While many of us would love to start the list with "cleaning bedrooms," the following is probably a more fun (and realistic) list.

1. Scavenger hunts

An oldie but a really goodie. For the younger crowd, have kids collect items based on colours (such as three red items, three blue items, etc.), and for older kids, items can be collected based on letters of the alphabet.

2. Collages

Go through photo collections, print out favourites, and make a creative collage for a fun and thoughtful gift for a special friend or family member.

3. Unlimited painter's tape games

One roll of painter's tape = countless activities. Create a long jump "pit" with several spaced-out lines of tape and see how far kids can jump. Perhaps they get further each time they try! Fashion your very own indoor hopscotch court and used rolled up socks or beanbags as markers. Design a race track for toy cars, trucks, and trains.

4. Fashion show

Unleash your child's inner diva with a raid of home closets and the dress-up box. Suggest categories for outfits such as stylish or silly. Don't forget the runway, the music, and the flash of the paparazzi taking pictures.

5. Balloon tennis

Using hands, tennis rackets, back scratchers, pool noodles, or other devices, make your own Wimbledon court. (Strawberries and cream and finger sandwiches are strongly encouraged.)

6. Slime!

This squishy, oozy fad is not going away anytime soon. And why would we want it to? Make your own slime using myriad internet-provided instructions. Create slime in different colours and themes.

7. Living room picnic

Spread out your favourite blanket and include the kids in the preparation of their favourite lunch items. Who knows? Maybe after the break, they will make their own lunches! (A parent can dream.)

8. Paper airplanes

There are so many ways to craft a super-sleek aircraft. Ramp up the fun by designing a landing strip. Can you fly your plane into a large pot, a large circle cut out of paper on the floor, or through a hula hoop?

9. House of cards

Skip the Netflix version, grab a pack of playing cards, and see how high your kids can build a tower.

10. Rock painting

With warm, sunny days ahead, prepare to beautify your outdoor space with colourful, painted rocks. Decorate rocks with multiple colours, pictures, dates, and kids' names.

11. Forts

Go old-school with pillows and blankets, or create a full-day activity by picking up a large appliance cardboard box. Cut out a door, a window or two, and provide craft materials including paint, markers, glue, feathers, ribbons, and stickers for kids to make their very own stylish tiny house. Don't forget to stock the fort with cushions, flashlights, books, and snacks.

12. Domino run

Pick up a few boxes of dominoes at your local dollar or toy store and set up a domino run. Start small with a straight line of dominoes and increase the challenge with varying shapes of runs.

13. Freeze dance

Think of this as a super way to burn off excess energy as well as an always-fun game. Crank up your kids' favourite songs and when the DJ (designated kid or parent) stops the music, players must freeze in their spot.

14. Puppet show

With a few craft supplies and a whole lot of creativity, have your kids make their own puppets, write a script, and perform a show. Think *Sound of Music* without the goats.

15. Twister

Using the official board or your own home-designed version, there is never a dry eye (as in happy, laughing tears) when getting tied up in knots with your friends and family.

16. Obstacle course

When designing an obstacle course indoors or outside, it's all about movement. Crawl under an object, jump over an object, run around an object, slide between objects, and laugh!

17. Board games

Think the old favourites: Hungry Hippos, Clue, Sorry, Monopoly, Candyland, Snakes and Ladders, and Yahtzee.

18. Indoor basketball

The methods of playing indoor basketball are practically limitless. Have kids toss balled-up socks into laundry hampers, ping pong balls into cups, stuffed animals into hula hoops, etc.

19. Bake

Channel your inner Martha Stewart and bake cookies from scratch. Or channel your inner Betty Crocker and get a pre-made mix. No one is judging!

20. Juggle

It takes a lot of skill and coordination to become a master juggler but with a lot of practice with one, two, and eventually, three items found around the house, juggling can become a party favourite. (Just be sure to lock the knives away while looking for potential juggling props!)

What is Lemonade Day?

Lemonade Day is a free, fun, experiential learning program that teaches youth, Kindergarten to high school, how to start, own and operate their own business – a lemonade stand.

Along the way, kids acquire skills in goal-setting, problem solving, and gain self-esteem critical for future success, all while having FUN!

When is it?

Lemonade Day for Northern Alberta is on **Saturday June 18, 2022**

Who can participate?

Youth of all ages, from **Kindergarten through High School**, can register to participate in Lemonade Day.

Registration opens on March 1, 2022 and will close June 1, 2022.

How does Lemonade Day work?

Once a child has registered for Lemonade Day, they will then pick a location to attend Lemonade University.

At University each child receives a backpack with an Entrepreneur Workbook where they learn the lessons of Lemonade Day. Our facilitator will guide them through the workbook where they will learn skills like creating budgets, setting profit-making goals, serving customers, repaying investors, and giving back to the community.

After attending Lemmy U kids are eligible to enter their area's "Best Tasting Lemonade Contest" if they choose.

Then on June 18, 2022 all participants will set up their Lemonade Stands in their towns and try their hand at running their own business. On that day they can also enter in their areas "Best Lemonade Stand Contest" as well as the "Best Entrepreneur Contest".

Kids who participate in Lemonade Day keep all the profit their stands make, but the program encourages them to save some, spend some and share some.

Once Lemonade Day is over kids can then enter their business results on the Lemonade day Northern Alberta website and they will be entered to WIN a New Bike.
