From the Office

As we head into the next leg of our school year, we are excited about the many opportunities we have planned to connect as a school, with parents, and with the community! Please read about some of our upcoming events. More information will be shared about each as we approach those activities.

Students and Staff Connection

Assemblies - Students and staff gathered in the gym on May 4th for our first in-person assembly. We will be coming together for two assemblies in June as well.

School-wide Field trips - We have the opportunity for students and staff to build community after being cohorted so long. As we have included all of the staff at VES, we are able to have small groups with each supervisor and will not have parents join us that day. Both field trips will be outside trips.

(June 9th) - Grade 1-3 Field trip to Elk Island Park

This field trip was specially designed for VES and includes three hands-on programs about the wetlands plants, animals, insects, and indigenous stories that meet many of our curricular goals.

(June 10th) - Grade 4-6 Field trip to Fort Edmonton

We will visit the Fort Edmonton site to learn about Alberta's history including the culture and experiences of first nations and metis, fur trading, and how Edmonton grew from a hamlet to a city.

Thank you for supporting these unique opportunities for our staff and students to reconnect.

Indigenous Day - Our school will be participating in activities to further our knowledge about First Nation peoples Treaty 6. We are still working on the details surrounding this day.

School, Parent, and Community Connection

These offer the opportunity for students to connect with our community and parents. Letters from the classroom teachers will come out with details and where parent help as supervisors may be needed.

AR Celebration and Family Picnic (June 24th) - This is a day to celebrate literacy. A special part of this day will be a family picnic. More details to follow.

Grade Six Farewell (June 28th) - Parents and grandparents will be invited to join their grade six student in the gym for this celebration. The kindergarten through grade 5 students will be watching this through a Google Meet. Prior to the ceremony, the students will be honoured by the students of VES through a school-wide parade. Immediately after the celebration, the students will be going over to the Vermilion Valley Lodge for a short parade to connect with our seniors.

Kindergarten Celebration (June 27th) - Parents and grandparents will be invited to join their kindergarten student from 11:45 am to 12:30 pm in the gym. KA students will have their lunch early, and KB students will just be there for the celebration. There will be a letter to parents outlining the details prior to that.

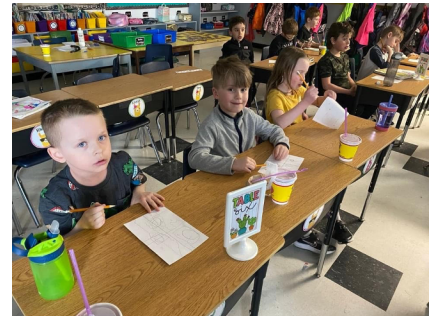
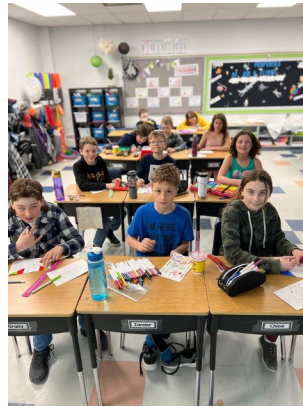
COMMUNITY CONNECTION

BTPS STUDENT FEES

Please remember to check the email that BTPS sends on the 27th of each month with invoices for Transportation, Tech & Supplemental Support Fees. Fees can be paid by cash, cheque (payable to BTPS), or online via PayPal. You can find the link to pay fees online on the parent page of the Vermilion Elementary School website by clicking on the Parents tab and then [Pay Fees](#). You will need your child's Alberta Student Number to complete the payment which is found on your BTPS Invoice for fees.



PICK-UP/DROP-OFF COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Parents/Guardians/Caregivers/Visitors Entering the School

All visitors to the school must use proper hand hygiene upon entering, and complete the BTPS [daily screening app](#). Visitors, students or staff who feel ill or have symptoms of COVID-19 cannot enter the school.

As you enter the building through the main entrance ONLY, you will follow the visitor protocol outlined here.

- **Complete the BTPS COVID-19 app on the ipad provided or use your own device to complete the app. To open the app, scan the QR code with your device camera.**
- **Sanitize your hands with the provided sanitizer.**
- **Sanitize the IPAD after use with the provided wipes.**



All visitors, including those coming for Vermilion Play Development and Before/After School Care, MUST use the front entrance to enter the building and must follow the visitor instructions in the front entrance.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Parents and caregivers must access their children daily for symptoms of cold, influenza, COVID-19, or other infectious respiratory disease before sending them to school. Anyone showing symptoms listed on the [Alberta Health Daily Checklist](#) must remain home. Information about isolation requirements is [available here](#).

If your child is going to be absent/late, even if buses are not running please let your child's teacher know or call the office to notify us. If you have not contacted the school office or teacher to inform us if your child will be absent/late, we will call you to ensure your child is safe. Please note if you are emailing a teacher during the school day, they may not always get them in time to avoid a call from the automated system.



PARKING

Parents and visitors are able to park on 49 Avenue, as well as south of the crosswalk on 44 Street. **Please ensure that you are not parking in front of the school in the bus loading/unloading zone from 8:00-9:30 am and from 2:30-4:00 pm.** We ask that parents & visitors also refrain from parking in the staff parking lot as this is reserved for staff members and for safety reasons students may not be dropped off or picked up in the parking lot.



FROM THE BUS LANE

BUS FEE PAYMENTS:

Parents and guardians can now pay their bus fees online. Go to your school website, Parents tab, Pay Fees. You will need your child's Alberta Student Number to make the payment. It can be found on the invoice. For assistance please email transportation@btps.ca. We also accept e-transfers. The email is vivian.locher@btps.ca, and in the message include: school name, child's name, bus route number and bussing service you are paying for (i.e. Vermilion Intown, Wainwright Intown, Yard Service, etc.).

BUS CANCELLATION - COLD WEATHER:

The BTPS Inclement Weather 701.11AP and 701.12AP includes a -40°C clause. If the temperature with or without a windchill factor reaches -40°C buses will not run. The temperature will be read at 6:00 pm the night before and based on the next day projected temperatures (with windchill) between 6:00-9:00 am for the morning run and from 3:00-5:00 pm for the afternoon run. On mornings when weather conditions are poor, parents will be advised by their bus driver and/or by an emergency announcement regarding bus cancellations on the [BTPS Website](#).

BUS STATUS APP:

Buffalo Trail Public Schools launched their new [website](#) in October that comes with the Bus Status App that allows parents to subscribe to their child(ren)'s school bus route. The division will use the Bus Status App to alert parents when a bus is delayed or cancelled. Bus drivers will continue to notify families of bus cancellations, but this will aid in the communication process to ensure no one gets missed. You can download the new Bus Status App by Box Clever on your smart phone or device.

Tap on "All Buses" to find and star the buses you want to receive status notifications for. Then select the district in the lower right corner and select "Buffalo Trail Public Schools". To choose your bus route to get notifications and status alerts, select the bottom middle icon "All Buses" on the main page. Then you can search for your bus route number or driver's name to find your child's bus route. Click on your child's bus route and the star should turn white. You have now selected your bus route. When there is a change in that bus route's status you will be notified by an alert on the BUS STATUS APP. Please email transportation@btps.ca if you have any problems with the process.

As with any absence, students who miss material will be provided with an opportunity to receive instructional material through an alternate means or catch up on missed school work upon return to school.

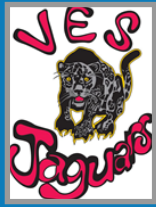
Students are required to be in attendance until the last day of school as identified by the BTPS Board Approved Calendar. Final exams at the Grade 7 to 9 level will occur during the last five student days each semester. During non-examination times, tutorials, course review and alternate activities will occur. Final exams in diploma courses will occur as described in the Alberta Education Diploma exam schedule (www.education.alberta.ca) and submission of marks will occur the day prior to the diploma marks submission date. During non-examination times, tutorials, course review and alternate activities will occur.
